

Bachelor of Arts or Science (Psychology) Course Selection Guide

- Students should take PSYC 1110 and PSYC 1120 in their first year, as well as one course chosen from: COMM 1501, COMM 2211, LIBR 2100 or WRIT 1120 in Fall or Winter semester.
- You can take MATH 2208 and Math 2209 in either your first year or second year.
- The difference between the BA and BSc in Psychology is your minor. If you choose a science minor, your degree will be BSc Psychology. If you choose an arts minor, your degree will be a BA Psychology.
- Use the table below to plan your course selections for the fall and winter semesters. Refer to the Subject List and the Courses Open to First-Year Students to select courses.
- A course could be offered a number of different times in different time slots, so students in the same program often have different class schedules.
