Tuition

- Depends on the number of courses you are taking
- No monthly payment option


- Tuition

Employment Income

- Minimum wage in Nova Scotia: \$15.70
- 24 hours/week during academic year
- Mandatory deductions (roughly 1/3 of pay cheque)
- Approximate weekly take home pay at minimum wage: \$251.20
- Approximate monthly take home pay at minimum wage: \$1004.80

^{**}Resicence fees and meal plan fees are due at the start of each semester, you pay the amount listed here in September, then again in January.

^{***} On a higher budget, this sheet assumes you have selected the most comprehensive meal plan, which means you need to purchase very little, if any, extra food. On a lower budget, you may have selected the smallest meal plan, but you would have to purchase almost all of your food at the grocery store and cook for yourself. This option is only available in Westwood apartment style, or Birch 5, which are not the lowest cost residence options. The lowest cost residence spaces will mean a higher cost meal plan, since you don't have access to a kitchen.
