Join Us for "The LGBT Purge: Why It Matters More Now Than Ever" with Michelle Douglas

We're thrilled to share about an upcoming event during convocation week: a public talk by Michelle Douglas titled "The LGBT Purge: Why It Matters More Now Than Ever." Michelle, the Executive Director of the LGBT Purge Fund, will be in Halifax to receive an honorary degree from Mount Saint Vincent University on the May 17 Convocation. Michelle will deliver her presentation on May 15th at the Halifax Public Library from 6 - 8 pm.

Michelle's talk will shed light on the historic discrimination faced by LGBTQI+ members of the Canadian Armed Forces, RCMP, and federal public service, especially during the "LGBT Purge" of the 1950s to mid-1990s, and the ongoing work toward reconciliation and memorialization.

Michelle was honourably discharged from the military in 1989 being deemed "Not Advantageously Employable Due to Homosexuality." She launched a landmark legal challenge against the military's discriminatory policies against LGBT service members that resulted in the ending of Canada's discriminatory policies in 1992.

Professionally, Michelle had a 30-year career in public service. She retired from the federal Department of Justice in 2019 where she held the position of Director of International Relations. She was awarded the Queen Elizabeth II Diamond Jubilee Medal in 2012 and was

| presented with the Canada Pride Citation in 2023. She was recently named an Honorary Colonel in the Canadian Armed Forces. |

The Canada Foundation for Innovation (CFI) has announced the release of the draft call for proposals for the 2025 Innovation Fund competition.

CFI welcomes feedback from the Canadian research community and other stakeholders until May 17, 2024. The input received will be considered when preparing the official call for proposals for 2025, which will be posted in early June 2024.

Sensitive Technology Research and Affiliations of Concern (STRAC) Policy

In accordance with the <u>Sensitive Technology Research and Affiliations of Concern (STRAC)</u>
<u>Policy</u>, grant applications submitted by a university or affiliated research institution to the federal granting agencies and the Canada Foundation for Innovation involving research that

aims to advance a <u>Sensitive Technology Research Area</u> will not be funded if any of the researchers involved in activities supported by the grant are currently affiliated with, or in receipt of funding or in-kind support, from a <u>Named Research Organization</u>.

The federal granting agencies are implementing the STRAC Policy in a harmonized manner, to funding opportunities that launched as of May 1, 2024. Further guidance, including detailed procedures and a <u>list of funding opportunities</u> that will apply this Policy, have been published through the <u>Tri-Agency Guidance on the STRAC Policy</u> webpage.

Please consult the appropriate funding opportunity literature to determine whether the STRAC Policy applies and, where applicable, for any additional information on procedures to be followed.

Resulting Changes for rolling intake funding opportunities, such as Alliance

As of May 1, 2024, new requirements will apply to <u>all Alliance grant applications</u> aiming to advance a listed sensitive technology research area. Further information on these new requirements, including <u>new responsibilities of researchers</u> and <u>responsibilities of institutions</u>, are provided on the <u>Tri-Agency Guidance on the STRAC Policy webpage</u>.

This includes, at the application phase, a requirement for researchers in named roles to complete the <u>Attestation for Research Aiming to Advance Sensitive Technology Research Areas Form.</u>

Submission of Alliance applications will temporarily pause, starting on April 26 at 12:00pm EDT, to enable the necessary changes to <u>the online system</u> supporting these updated requirements. Applicants will be able to submit their Alliance applications starting May 3, 2024.

Note that all applications currently being prepared in NSERC's online system, but not yet submitted by the pause, will need to include the completed attestation form(s) if that application aims to advance a listed sensitive technology research area.

Tri-Agency Guidance on Research Security

The federal research funding agencies also encourage consulting the Safeguarding your Research portal, which provides additional resources and tools for the academic community to assess and mitigate security risks associated with their research.
